• HOMELESS SHELTER STATUS, HISTORY & WHAT'S NEEDED TO CREATE MORE BEDS (continued)

- Stats, presented by Michael Torres
 - Shelter Provider: Outsiders Inn; Presented by Adam Cravitz
 - St. Paul's, Men's Shelter on Franklin St.
 - 25 Beds
 - Open 7 days a week; evening and overnights from 6:30PM 7:00AM
 - o Weekends and holidays all day.
 - 50% returning & 37% permanent exits.
 - Length of stay is approximately 94 days.
 - They are seeing a lot of people with high medical needs.
 - Shelter Provider: Bertha's Place & Bertha's Place Too; Presented by Samantha Forrester
 - Bertha's Place
 - Single Women/Couples/Elderly 55+
 - o 58 Residents (served last month)
 - o 94% Bed Utilization
 - o 67% Successful exits
 - Bertha's Place Too
 - Single Women/Couples/Elderly 55+
 - o 32 Residents (served last month)
 - o 100% Bed Utilization
 - o 45% successful exits
 - Challenges: Lack of affordable housing, staffing, refusing to transition from shelter.
 - Trend: significant medical, mental health and SUD issues, high rising amount of elderly.
 - Significant discussion regarding, bed space metrics, costs for running shelters and safe stays.

HOMELESS PROGRAM OUTCOMES & DISCUSSION ON GAPS IN SERVICES

- Presented by Michael Torres
 - Homeless System-level Program Outcomes (May/June 2023)
 - Adult Shelter: Served 289/331; 90%/90% utilization; 49%/40% successful exits;
 27%/14% Return to homeliness.
 - Youth Shelter: Served 12/4; 42%/53% utilization; 75%/67% successful exits; 20%/67% Return to homeliness.

- Transitional Housing: Served 94/99; 96%/95% utilization; 100%/25% successful exits;
 0% Return to homeliness.
- Rapid Rehousing: Served 389/391; N/A; 75%/97% successful exits; 0% Return to homeliness.
- PSH: Served 126/126; 97%/97% utilization; 100%/99% successful exits; 0% Return to homeliness.
- 9,032 people were homeless in 2022 and 68% (6,119) people were identified as newly homeless.
- 190+ year-round emergency shelter beds were added between 2020 and 2023.
- In 2022 there was a 57% increase with persons that accessed shelters than in 2021.
- In 2022 there was 2421 people that asked for Shelter and 1857 people received shelter.
