We have an update on the Holly Park Shopping Center (who knew it had a name?) . This is the one at 104th St. and Hwy 99 that burned down a couple of years ago and it is fairly good news. The developer has related to us that many of the previous tenants will be renewing their presence in our neighborhood there. In the next few weeks we should see much activity in the center with the brick facings being applied and finishing touches throughout. The tenants who have committed to renewing their presence in our neighborhood are a pet grooming store, a veterinarian, Papa Murphy's, a nail salon, a bookkeeping office and of course the corner convenience market. As you may remember, Fatty Patty's had closed prior to the fire and that was a big surprise to all of us but the listing agent said they hope to find a restaurant to take over that area as well.

Across the street, the former Star House Chinese Restaurant had become a real eyesore. It is being remodeled into office space for 2 new businesses . The interior work is progressing now having been delayed like everything by Covid -19. This is certainly good news indeed. The site is currently being used as the staging area for Hwy 99 road works including 99th and Hwy 99.

That work includes a sidewalk down Hwy 99 from 99th to 102nd but the main sidewalk down to 117th are way down the list. The cost estimates and a design have been completed but reduced grant funding mean cutbacks from the State Transportation Improvement Board. So we'll continue to wait!
