A RESOLUTION relating to the adoption of the Clark County Public Participation Plan that will be used
for the update of the Buildable Lands Program pursuant to the Revised Code of Washington Chapter
36.70A RCW.

WHEREAS, Clark County adopted an updated 20-Year Comprehensive Growth Management Plan 2015-2035 through Ordinances 2016-06-12 and 2017-07-04 to meet the goals and requirements of Chapter 36.70A RCW; and

WHEREAS, in 2017, E2SSB 5254 was passed by the Washington State Legislature and constituted the first major revision to the program since its inception in 1997; and

WHEREAS, in 2018, Washington State Department of Commerce updated the Buildable Lands Guidelines to include the new state requirements; and

WHEREAS, Clark County is undertaking a review and evaluation of its Buildable Lands Program, as required by the Review and Evaluation Program (program) established in RCW 36.70A.215 and WAC 365-196-315.

WHEREAS, the purpose of the program, RCW 36.70A.215 (1)(a) is to determine whether a county and its cities are achieving urban densities within urban growth areas by comparing growth and development assumptions, targets, and objectives contained in the countywide planning policies and the county and city comprehensive plans with actual development; and

WHEREAS, this update will help Clark County meet state requirements of submitting its next Buildable Lands Program report by June 30, 2021; and

WHEREAS, RCW 36.70A.140 requires counties to conduct outreach to "establish and broadly disseminate to the public a public participation program identifying procedures providing early and continuous public participation in the development and amendment of comprehensive land use plans and development regulations implementing such plans; and

WHEREAS, Clark County Council (Council) after effective notice considered the Buildable Lands Program Public Participation Plan (Exhibit 1) at a duly advertised public hearing on July 16, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the Council at its duly noticed public hearing took public testimony and considered all comments presented to the Council; and

WHEREAS, the Council finds that adoption of the Buildable Lands Program Public Participation Plan will further the public health, safety and welfare; now therefore,

BE IT HEREBY ORDERED, RESOLVED AND DECREED BY THE CLARK COUNTY COUNCIL, CLARK COUNTY, STATE OF WASHINGTON, as follows:

Clark County Buildable Lands Program Public Participation Plan

Introduction

Clark County is undertaking a review and evaluation of its Buildable Lands Program, as required by the Review and Evaluation Program (program) established in Revised Code of Washington (RCW) 36.70A.215 and Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 365-196-315. The purpose of the review and evaluation program, RCW 36.70A.215(1)(a) is to determine whether a county and its cities are achieving urban densities within urban growth areas by comparing growth and development assumptions, targets, and objectives contained in the countywide planning policies and the county and city comprehensive plans with actual development. In 2017, E2SSB 5254 was passed by the Washington State Legislature and constituted the first major revision to the program since its inception in 1997. In 2018, Washington State Department of Commerce updated the Buildable Lands Guidelines to include the new state requirements. These new guidelines will ensure Clark County's buildable lands methodology complies with recent legislative changes prior to submitting the required Buildable Lands Program Report by the June 30, 2021 deadline.

A Public Participation Plan (plan) is a communication program that provides members of the public opportunities for early and continuing participation and to provide public access to key decision making processes with Clark County Council. [RCW 36.70A.035]. The plan describes the steps that Clark County will take to provide opportunities for public engagement and public comment, as well as Clark County contact information and web addresses. This plan is in addition to the public participation required by Clark County Code Section 40.510.040 and 40.560.010.

1.0 Public Participation Goals

- Provide interested parties with timely information, an understanding of the process, and opportunities to review and comment on proposed amendments to the Buildable Lands Program review.
- Actively solicit information from citizens, property owners and stakeholders about their concerns, questions and priorities for the Buildable Lands Program review process.
- Encourage interested parties to informally review and comment on proposed changes to the guidelines throughout the process and provide those comments to decision makers.
- Provide for public input at project milestones prior to decision-making by local officials.
- Consult and consider recommendations from the General Public, Environmental community, Business community, Tribe, Cities, and State Government Agencies.

2.0 Public Participation Opportunities

Clark County is committed to providing multiple opportunities for public participation throughout the process. Clark County will use a variety of communication tools to inform the public and encourage their participation, including the following:

2.1 Website

Clark County's website will include a Buildable Lands Program webpage where interested parties can access status updates, draft documents, official notices, minutes and other project information. The webpage will be the primary repository of all information related to the

Buildable Lands Program review process. The page will include who to contact for more information and an email link for questions and comments. Documents will be available for review at the Clark County Community Planning Department. https://www.clark.wa.gov/community-planning/buildable-lands-program

2.2 Email Distribution List

An email list of interested parties will be created and maintained by Clark County. The list will be used to notify interested parties regarding Buildable Lands Program review progress and participation opportunities. Interested parties will be added to the list by contacting the Community Planning Department, sign-in sheets, web portal, and email. 2.3 Media

The local news media will be kept up-to-date on the Buildable Lands Program review process and receive copies of all official notices. In addition, notices will be published in the paper of record.

2.4 Project Advisory Committee

Clark County will appoint a project advisory committee (PAC) to solicit public feedback on the Buildable Lands Program review. The committee may include representatives from the following: Clark County Realtors Association; the Building Industry Association; City of Vancouver and a smaller city; Clark County Responsible Growth Forum; Columbia River Economic Development Council; Clark County Citizens United; Friends of Clark County; Clark County Development Engineering Advisory Board; Clark County Planning Commission, and Clark County Neighborhood Associations. Community Planning commits to hold public meetings at convenient times and at locations that are accessible. Meeting information is made available through the webpage, email and paper of record. https://www.clark.wa.gov/community-planning/buildable-lands-program

2.5 Written Comments

Interested parties will be encouraged to provide comments to Clark County by letter, email, or web-based forms throughout the public process. All comments received will be forwarded to the Clark County Council for their consideration prior to their hearings.

2.6 Public Comment Periods and Hearings

The Clark County Council will hold televised (through CVTV) public hearing before final adoption. Interested parties are encouraged to provide comments for review and provide testimony during hearings.

Public notice of all hearings will state who is holding the comment period and/or hearing, the date and time, and the location of any public hearing. Notices will be published per official policy and comply with all other legal requirements such as the Americans with Disabilities Act. A notice will be sent to the email list (2.2, above) and the Department of Commerce.
