#### **Did you know? Neighborhood Associations are NOT an HOA!**

Neighborhood residents have formed our neighborhood associa-  
tion and Clark County's Neighborhood Program Coordinator works  
with us as a liaison for information to be shared with citizens.  
HOA's are established by a developer and pertains to a specific  
subdivision or project. Everyone in Clark County is in a neigh-  
borhood association, though many are inactive because no volunteers  
have stepped forward to operate them. Volunteers regularly re-  
ceive information from Clark County so their members can be  
better informed on issues such as annexation plans,  
new housing or business development, etc.
