

GREEN BAG PROJECT: A NEW WAY TO COLLECT FOOD FOR THOSE WHO ARE IN NEED

Cities in Oregon, California and at least one community in Vancouver are using this new method. It consists of neighborhood coordinators working with their neighbors as long term food donors.

A food bag is supplied to the neighbor and then picked on a specific day every other month. This provides food pantries with a steady, year round supply of food and provides donors with the ongoing satisfaction of making a real difference. The instructions to the neighbor suggest they buy one extra nonperishable grocery item each week when they go the supermarket. The food items are then stored in the food bag to be picked up on the scheduled day. The food would go to whomever the neighborhood association designates. At least some would be given to school community resource centers.

At the current time, county neighborhood associations, Truman and NE Hazel Dell have started the Green Bag Project in their neighborhoods. The program has been highly successful and has been met with much enthusiasm and participation. The program makes it very easy to help, should Sunnyside NA choose to join the effort. We would not just be helping hungry neighbors who receive food — we would be building

This is a fun way to meet some of your neighbors if you choose to help with distribution and pick-up of bags. Each coordinator would decide how much of an area they wish to cover. If Sunnyside NA were to implement this project, community members will be needed to distribute and collect the food bags every two months. Collectors will determine whom to give the green collection bags to, just to their immediate neighbors if they wish. At the next meeting on October 10, we will talk more about this. If we decide to join in this effort, we will be inviting people to volunteer to do pick-ups and bag distributions as well as seeking food donors.

DIY All-Purpose Cleaner

By making your own cleaning products at home, you can save money, use fewer chemicals, and reduce packaging waste! Try this easy recipe for an all-purpose cleaner. Use on countertops, floors, walls, upholstery, and carpet. (Do not use on granite or marble). Combine:

- ¼ cup white vinegar
- 1 tsp Castile soap (olive oil-based soap, like Dr. Bronners)
 - ½ cup warm water
 - Optional: lemon rind, sprig of rosemary, or scented essential oil.

FREIGHT RAIL DEPENDENT DEVELOPMENT ALONG CHELATCHIE PRAIRIE RAILROAD

There is an ongoing proposal before the Clark Council that would change some zoning along the Chelatchie Prairie Railroad and would affect many residents. This is something you may wish to pay attention to! Clark County has been collecting community feedback on proposed development codes that would allow freight rail-dependent development adjacent to the county's short line Chelatchie Prairie Railroad. Even though the opportunity to take the online survey has ended, citizens may still email their Clark County council members with their feedback. Development along the Chelatchie Prairie Railroad would be a significant impact to all who live near. Job creation would be a positive, but there would also be possible traffic congestion, noise, among other problems. The Council is also considering an expansion of the adopted overlay. The 2017 Legislature enacted 3ESB5517 that amended the Growth Management Act to allow "freight rail dependent uses" and gives Clark and Okanogan counties authority to allow such uses adjacent to short **line railroads.** The county council appointed an advisory committee to develop and recommend regulations that identify types of developments, where they can be built, and development standards to reduce impacts. Overlay Explained: In January of 2018, the county

council approved Phase I of the Freight Rail-Dependent Use Overlay project which included the initial overlay and new policies. The overlay indicates additional uses beyond what is already allowed in the underlying zone for the property. That means present zoning would be changed by the overlay. You can do the following to keep up with what is going

RECYCLING UPDATE

The following is an update for handling recyclable materials. Dan and Judy attended a Recycling 101 Walk and Talk Tour earlier this spring. We were given the following information,

Recycling Right Made Easy!

Helpful service reminders and answers to your recycling questions are right at your fingertips with the RecycleRight tool. Find it online at www.wcnorthwest.com or download it for your smart device from the Apple App Store or Google Play. Enter your address in the RecycleRight tool to see your pick-up schedule for garbage, recycling, and yard debris. Sign up for reminders on regular service days as well as important notices about weather-related and holiday route delays or cancellations. Choose to receive these announcements by phone call, text, or email.

Have questions about how to recycle an item? RecycleRight has the answers! Simply enter an item in the search tool and you'll find disposal options here in Clark County.

Curbside Reminders:

Household Batteries Tape the ends of rechargeable batteries and put household batteries in a clear, sealed, plastic bag and place on top of your recycling cart. It's best to set out batteries when you also plan to set out your glass recycling bin so the driver can see the bag.

Motor Oil and Antifreeze Pour in a clear, one-gallon, jug. Important - do not mix or add other liquids. Label 'Motor Oil' or 'Antifreeze'. Place next to your recycling cart so it's visible for the driver.

Plastic Bags Never put plastic bags or any kind of stretchy plastic in your recycling cart. It will wrap around and clog the sorting equipment at the transfer station. Instead, take plastic bags (shopping bags, produce bags, bread bags, dry cleaning bags, and clean and dry zip lock bags) to a local grocery store. Many stores are participating in plastic bag and film wrap

collection in Clark County. Find the receptacle by the shopping carts.
