Action Item	Minutes
Meeting called to order	1:30 PM
Court ADA Policy	<p>Tim McVicker distributed the draft Clark County Courts ADA and Accommodation policy for the committee to review. Tim has been meeting with the Superior Court Administration Office, the District Court Clerk's Office and the Superior Court Clerk's Office to draft a policy and procedures to ensure qualified individuals with disabilities have full access to the judicial system within Clark County.</p>
County Self-Evaluation	<p>Tim McVicker distributed a Title I and Title II draft self-evaluation check list for the committee to review. Tim conducted a self-evaluation for Clark County on its programs, services and activities about 4 years ago but a new evaluation needs to be conducted.</p> <p>The committee was asked how they wanted to conduct the surveys. It was decided that the committee should meet with each department, use the self-evaluation form to guide the interview process and to record the results of the evaluations for each department.</p> <p>Wayne Yarnall suggested that the Assessor's Office be the first office contacted for this purpose. Tim McVicker will attempt to schedule a meeting with the Assessor's Office and the Committee during May 2009.</p>
Park Surveys	<p>Several of the County parks need to be surveyed for accessibility. Tim suggested that the Committee commence the surveys in June when the weather improves.</p>
