



## PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE CLARK COUNTY 2008 ACTION PLAN

### Summary of Amendment to 2008 Action Plan

As a result of funds provided under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) for the Community Development Block Grant program (CDBG), Clark County intends to amend the 2008 Action Plan to make CDBG-R funds available to address county housing and community development needs. The total CDBG-R funds available are \$356,690. The Urban County Policy Board selected the following projects for funding.

1. **City of Camas Goot Park Improvements.** A series of improvements for Goot Park, including an ADA compliant and centrally located bathroom facility, off-street parking, sidewalks, safe play structures and paths to link facilities together. This project will be provided a pre-award, which will have no effect on recipient's eligibility for future grants. CDBG Budget: \$258,000 from ARRA funds.
2. **Clark County Public Health Septic Repair and Replacement Program.** This program will provide no-interest deferred payment loans to approximately 18 low and moderate-income households to repair or replace septic systems that have been identified by Public Health as failing. CDBG Budget: \$150,000 from 2009 entitlement, ARRA funds (\$41,121) and reprogrammed funds.

3. **Janus Youth Oak Bridge Youth Shelter Remodel.** Upgrade and remodel of Oak Bridge Youth Shelter will include improvements to kitchen and food storage pantry, bathrooms and flooring replacement. CDBG Budget: \$30,000 from ARRA funds.
4. **Clark County CDBG Program General Program Administration.** Funds for overall management and coordination of the CDBG program by Clark County. CDBG Budget \$27,569 from ARRA funds.
