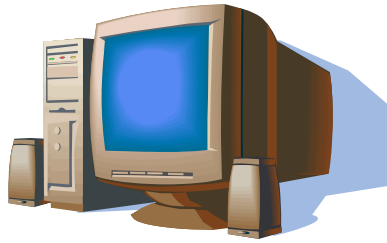

Yard Debris

Yard debris includes leaves, weeds, pruning's, grass clippings, brush and woody material up to four inches in diameter and five feet in length. Yard debris does not include food or vegetable wastes, household or hazardous wastes, animal waste, plastic or plastic bags, construction debris, dirt, sod, rocks, branches over four inches in diameter and five feet in length or stumps.

Clip the "Free leaf disposal coupon" above and is good October 1 to December 20. This coupon is for Vancouver and Clark County residents only. Contact Clark County Solid Waste for more information.

A significant amount of the waste discarded by people in Clark County is yard debris. There are much better alternatives for disposal of this material than putting it into the garbage and sending it to the landfill. By recycling your yard debris you can reduce the amount of debris placed in your garbage can. This can mean less garbage costs to you and less yard debris ending up in the landfill. With the ban on backyard burning in many areas, this service provides residents with an alternative disposal method. Your yard debris will be turned into compost, which is a beneficial resource.

Many people choose to compost yard debris in their own yard and for more information about how to do this call the Master Composter/Recyclers at (360) 882-0936 ext. 224.

If you'd prefer to dispose of yard debris another way, curbside collection is available on an optional basis throughout the county. Refer to our yard debris curbside collection program page for more information about this service.

There are also options available for those who would prefer to haul away their own yard debris, or have quantities too large to leave at the

curbside. Go to yard debris drop-off locations for this information.

Traffic Fatalities in Clark County

Here is just a snapshot of traffic related fatalities for Clark County; 2006-2010:

- 24 traffic deaths occurred in 2010; 108 traffic deaths occurred 2006 through 2010.
- 40% of persons killed in crashes were between the ages of 16-30; 77% were male.
- The majority of fatal crashes occurred on county roads followed by state highways, followed by the city of Vancouver.
- 11 traffic deaths involved alcohol or drug impaired drivers in 2010; 54 of 108 fatalities in 2006-2010 involved impaired drivers.
- Excessive speed was a factor in 12 fatal crashes in 2010; Speed was a factor in 40% of fatality crashes 2006-2010.
- Younger males are dying in crashes at a higher rate than in years past.
- From 2006-2010, 28 persons killed in passenger vehicle crashes were not wearing seat belts.
- Majority of fatality collisions occurred in unincorporated areas of the county, between Friday evening and early Monday Mornings.

FREE HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE (HHW) DISPOSAL

Bring unwanted hazardous products to a HHW collection facility or event.

WHAT IS HAZARDOUS WASTE?

Household hazardous waste (HHW) products include pesticides, paints, solvents, batteries, thinners, motor oil, and antifreeze. Look for signal words such as poison, danger, warning, caution or flammable on the label. To dispose of your HHW products:

DO:

- Keep HHW products separate. Do not mix.
- Bring products in their original containers when possible.
- Seal products to prevent leaks and spills.
- Keep products away from the driver and passengers, such as in a trunk, truck bed, or trailer.
- Keep children and pets away from collection sites and events.

DO NOT:

- Exceed 25 gallons or 220 pounds of HHW per visit.
- Bring unlabeled, empty or leaking containers, explosives or ammunition, radioactive or

infectious waste, or business-generated waste.

Clark County residents may dispose of unwanted household hazardous waste products at one of the following county sponsored HHW collection facilities or events. Living Habitat House

The Living Habitat House is a partnership between Department of Environmental Services and Evergreen Habitat for Humanity (EHFH) to build the first project permitted under the Clark County Sustainable Communities Pilot Program. The house will test alternative green materials and building methods.

The county is acting on one of the recommendations from the Sustainable Affordable Residential Development (SARD) studies. To allow for flexibility within its building codes, Clark County recently adopted the Sustainable Communities Pilot Program Ordinance (CCC 40.200.090). More than a greener way to build, the project:

- demonstrates affordable, resource-efficient housing, with lower operating costs
- puts vacant county-owned land to a higher use, including tax income
- leads by example by being the first project permitted under the county's new code and processes

The Living Habitat House will be built at 11217 NE Hazel Dell Avenue.

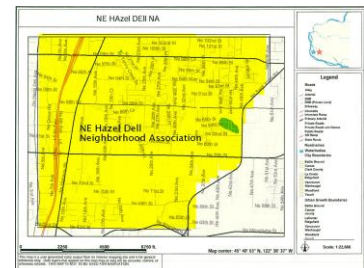
