Support Local Businesses in Hazel Dell

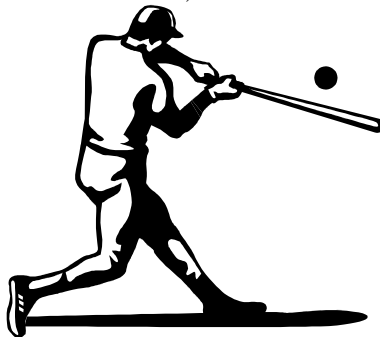

Kate & Clarence LaLonde Neighborhood Park Update

Clark County is getting ready to design a new park in our neighborhood.

Kate and Clarence LaLonde Neighborhood Park is located on Northeast 99th Street between 43rd and 50th avenues in Northeast Hazel Dell.

This 7.7-acre property is currently being leased as pastureland for livestock. It features rolling hills with trees scattered throughout. LaLonde Creek crosses the northeast corner of the property.

The county agreed to name the park in honor of Kate and Clarence LaLonde when it purchased the property from the family in 1999. Clarence LaLonde first bought the land from the state in 1911.

The project schedule current calls for planning and design to be completed by around the end of this year. Construction is scheduled to begin in 2010. This schedule is tentative and is subject to change.

Leadership Clark County Begins Recruitment for Class of 2009-2010

Leadership Clark County is now accepting applications for the Leadership Class of 2010, according to LCC chair, Jon Yamashita. Now in its 16th year, LCC is a 10-month training and development program that prepares citizens to become more effective community leaders by providing an opportunity to develop the knowledge and skills necessary to become active members of our community and assist in tackling the community's most pressing issues.

Enrollment is open to individuals from both public and private businesses and institutions and LCC seeks to fill the class with a broad spectrum of community members from diverse racial, ethnic, economic, and work experience backgrounds.

Over the ten month program period, participants attend a monthly session during which they hear from and interact with Clark County business

leaders, state legislators, local government officials, and community organization leaders, as well as participate in site tours around the county, case studies, and interactive panels. The course culminates with the presentation of the class members’ group projects, each designed to address an identifiable community need.

The classes run from September 2009 to graduation in June 2010 with approximately 36 participants. The application deadline for enrollment is April 30, 2009. Limited scholarships are available. 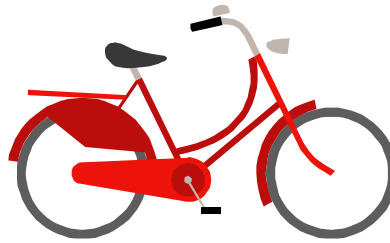

Comprehensive Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan

The County is in the process of preparing a "Comprehensive Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan". The purpose of the project is to establish a vision of a system, complementary to the vehicular transportation network; which enables safe and convenient non-motorized access to major destination points. Once completed, this plan will help identify the most effective projects that improve safety and mobility for bicyclists and pedestrians. The plan will be important in securing grant funding for prioritized projects in the capital improvement plan.

Canines for Clean Water

Doo something pawstitive for our streams!

1. SCOOP the poop
2. BAG it
3. Put it in the garbage!

Did you know that Clark County is home to over 103,000 dogs, who collectively generate almost 6,000 tons of poop a year!!

When it rains, the poop is washed into the nearest storm drain, which leads to the nearest stream or wetland.

Many of our local streams have fecal bacteria levels that exceed clean water standards.

SO PLEASE! PICK UP AFTER YOUR PET.

Carry a plastic bag in your pocket or tie it to your dogs leash when you go for a walk.

Place the bag in the garbage (not in your toilet!)

Keep pets on leash near waterways and sensitive areas.



Never wash pet waste down a storm drain. Storm drains carry water and any contaminants directly to streams without being treated!

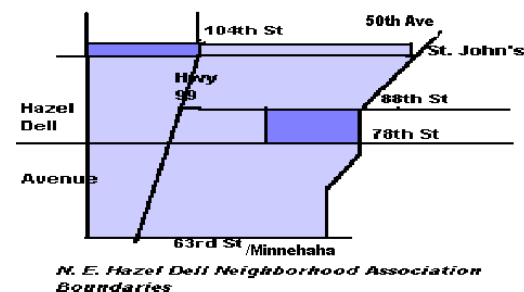
Neighborhood Association Mission:
