**Update -- Verizon Cell Phone Tower
Located Next to Tower Crest Park**

Allen R (Skip) Greene, the Verizon representative who briefed our NA meeting regarding this tower, shares that due to some personnel changes with Verizon this project has been delayed for a few months. Additionally some required studies have yet to be completed.

The length of the delay drives the requirement for Verizon to have another Neighborhood Meeting to update residents. This meeting will be scheduled later this year, after the required studies have been obtained.

Mr. Greene confirms the project design discussed at the last Neighborhood Association meeting is the final design - a 100' tall monopole within a fairly small fenced compound near the tree line south of the water tank.



Recycling



Film Plastics -- In an effort to recycle as much as possible, many people mistakenly put their plastic bags in their recycling carts. Unfortunately, plastic bags and other types of film plastics do more harm than good when disposed of in this way. Plastic bags, shrink wrap, bubble wrap and other types of "stretchy" film plastic easily tangle in the machinery that is meant to sort recyclables into separate categories. This slows efficiency of the facility, as the machines have to be shut down to allow workmen to climb in and cut out the bags with box cutters. This material accounts for at least a 25% reduction in efficiency.

So What Should I Do With Plastic Bags?

First and foremost, try to eliminate plastic film from your life as much as possible by taking your own reusable bags to the grocery store, reusing bubble wrap, and trying to reduce the amount of plastic film you buy in general. Reuse and Recycling: Plastic bags can be reused in your home (e.g. as waste basket liners or doggy poo scooper bags.) Any bags you don't reuse can be properly recycled by placing them in the receptacles found near the front of most grocery stores. This ensures they will be recycled with other materials of the same kind and not have a chance to choke recycling sorting machinery. For more information, go to wcnorthwest.com.*

DO NOT Recycle

- Styrofoam (™) packaging and food containers do NOT belong in the blue recycle roll carts.
- Kleenex and paper towels (Surprised??)

What SHOULD I Recycle?

- Paper egg cartons, newspapers, aluminum cans, catalogues, junk mail, rinsed food cans, cardboard, plastic containers with a neck (please remove the lid and squish), magazines, phone books, paper bags, cereal boxes, milk cartons, empty aerosol cans (please remove the plastic nozzle), etc.
- Scrap metal (no larger than 24" and less than 35 pounds) Scrap metal includes brass, aluminum, copper, and steel.
- Shredded paper can be put in the blue recycle roll cart but please first put it in a paper bag and staple the bag shut so the little fru-frus of paper don't escape



Is Glass Recycled??

Glass goes in the old bin used before the blue recycle roll carts arrived - the green one if you have a choice, but the brown or cream one is ok too.

Recycle Motor Oil & Antifreeze??

Used Motor Oil or Antifreeze should be placed in a clear one-gallon plastic jug with a screw top lid and placed near cart

- use clear one-gallon plastic jugs with screw-on lids; they fit snugly in a special space on the truck so they won't spill.
- don't mix oil or antifreeze with water, brake fluid, or other liquids.

CONTAMINATED OIL AND ANTIFREEZE ARE NOT RECYCLABLE; THEY SHOULD BE DISPOSED OF AS HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

What About Batteries??

Place Household Batteries On Top of Your Blue Recycle Cart

- Place all household batteries, including hearing aids batteries, batteries from flashlights, rechargeable appliances, , etc. in a clear, sealed plastic bag on top of your recycle cart.*

Two New Fire Stations


On July 18, 2016, the City Council awarded a construction contract to Corp Inc. Construction of Salem, Oregon. Construction of both stations began in August, 2016.

The existing fire stations will not close until the new stations are complete and operational, which will be in fall 2017.

The Vancouver Fire Department is relocating Fire Stations 1 and 2. Construction on both stations will begin in August and the stations are projected to open fall 2017. The new fire stations will improve service and response times – creating a safer community for those who work, live and play in our community!

Will Station 2 Coverage Affect You?

The proposed fire Station 2 coverage area will include the west side of Truman and a small SW portion of east Minnehaha. The blue line shows the northern section of station 2 area which incorporates a piece of Clark County and its residents who currently are served by Vancouver City Fire Station 5.



SCAMS

If you have received an unsolicited call from an individual purporting to be from the Internal Revenue Service or the Department of the Treasury, and/or making threats of legal action or even promises of federal grant funds, it is a fraud. There are a number of similar scams, some of which can be quite persuasive: in some, the scammers have done brief Internet research of potential victims so they appear to be familiar with their victim's personal details, and they use this information as a springboard to obtain more. DID YOU KNOW???

Walking Safely in Rural Areas

If you plan to walk in rural areas keep in mind a few important safety tips. Rural areas may have less traffic than big cities, but "a walk in the country" does require special care. Often the vehicles on rural roads travel at much higher speeds than pedestrians are used to, and drivers won't expect to see someone walking on or near the side of the road. So, remember the following safety rules and enjoy your walk!

- ❖ Always face oncoming traffic.
- ❖ Look for a smooth, stable surface alongside the road.
- ❖ If there are guardrails, see if there's a smooth, flat surface behind the barrier where you can walk.
- ❖ If you need to walk on a paved shoulder, stay as far away from traffic as possible.
- ❖ Watch for bridges and narrow shoulders.
- ❖ Be sure drivers can see you. Wear brightly colored clothing and if you walk during low-light hours-dusk or dawn- be sure you have reflective material on your jacket or walking shoes and carry a flashlight.

DID YOU KNOW???

You May Have Many Credit Scores!!



You can have more than one score, because:

- Lenders use different scores for different products.
- There are many different credit scoring formulas.
- Information can come from different credit reporting sources.

For example, your credit card score could be different from your home loan score, and the scores you purchase online could be different from both of those.

For some people, these differences aren't that big. But because lenders use different scores, you might qualify for lower rates with one lender and not another. It can pay to shop around.

Scams, Too

What's worse than losing money to a scammer? Losing more money to another scammer claiming to help you recover from the first one.

Yep; this really happens. It works like this: Con artists contact you because you're on their lists of people who lost money to scams. For a "small fee" or "donation" upfront, they promise to recover the money you lost from a prize scheme, bogus product offer, or some other scam.

Sometimes, they try to get you to contact them by putting their offers of "help" in the comments section of blog posts or online articles about scams. Some crooks claim to be from a government agency to appear trustworthy. Others pretend to be actual victims who got (supposed) help from some (fake) agency or company.

But it's all just a scam, too — another way for a scammer to profit from your loss. They're after your money, and if you share your payment information, they've got it

Here's how you can avoid these recovery scams:

1. **Don't pay upfront for a promise.** Someone might ask you to pay in advance for things – like help with recovering from a scam. Consider it a no-go if they ask you for money before they provide any "help".
2. **Don't send money or give out personal information** in response to an unexpected text, phone call, or email.
3. **Do online searches.** Type the name or contact information into your favorite search engine with the term "complaint" or "scam."
4. **Sign up for the FTC's free scam alerts** at ftc.gov/scams for the latest tips and advice about scams. And if you find yourself scammed after being scammed, file a complaint with the FTC.

Scam Alert From CCSO

Clark County Sheriff's Deputies investigated a reported "kidnapping phone call" originating from phone number (656) 322-5468. The complainant reported that she had received an alarming call on her cell phone with caller ID showing this number. The complainant told deputies that the female voice of an adult young woman was crying and sobbing and claiming she had been kidnapped and that the kidnapper had threatened to kill her. An adult male voice was heard in the background, demanding money or he would kill the woman.

Investigating deputies learned that the phone number is invalid and has reportedly been used in numerous similar kidnap hoax calls nation-wide to unsuspecting random members of the public as well as 911 dispatch centers. It's unknown if those perpetrating this hoax are actually attempting to defraud and profit from the victims or are just trying to create unnecessary public alarm.

An on-line search shows numerous public complaints concerning calls received from this number. Anyone receiving a call originating from (656) 322-5468 should be advised that the call is likely a scam/hoax and immediately hang up.


CFPB

CC Sheriff's Office Ends Medication Take Back Program

Effective July 15th, the Clark County Sheriff's Office will no longer be taking back prescription medications from the public. The decision to end the program is due to increasing demands on staff for core public safety services.

"This decision is in line with our need to shed services in light of our limited staffing," said Undersheriff Mike Cooke. "We need to give our employees the opportunity to do their core jobs really well, especially in this case where the private sector now provides resources to dispose of unused medications." In addition to our deputy sheriffs, staff from our support and evidence unit would routinely spend hours properly packaging and disposing of unused medications.

What is Smart911???

CRESA is implementing Smart911 in Clark County. Smart911 is a service that allows residents to create a free Safety Profile for their household that includes any information they want 9-1-1 and first responders to have in the event of an emergency.

When a phone having a Safety Profile dials 911, the profile is displayed to the 9-1-1 call taker providing information used to facilitate the proper response to the correct location.

How Can I sign up?

Sign up for Smart911 at Smart911.com. Create a Safety Profile for your household giving information about yourself, family members, your home, pets and even vehicles. It is private and secure as you control what information is in your profile and what is displayed when calling 9-1-1.

At a time when seconds count, Smart911 provides details that could impact response the second an emergency call is placed. potentially the difference between life and death.

WHY Sign Up

Medical Conditions: For individuals who are affected by epilepsy, diabetes, Alzheimer's, allergies or other medical conditions, Smart911 can inform responders of the medical issues, physical disabilities, medications and emergency contacts as well as useful information about service animals and pets.

Senior and Elderly Care: A Safety Profile can provide active seniors peace of mind. If an emergency should occur, 9-1-1 would have details on their home, and medical needs. Caretakers & family can be assured that if the person they care for dials 9-1-1, useful information is available (and the caretaker can be listed as an emergency contact).

General Emergencies: Anyone may experience an unplanned accident or need. Whether in a vehicle or your home, even the most basic details such as the address associated with a mobile phone is available to 9-1-1 response teams, aiding them to arrive more quickly.

58th Street Sidewalk Construction Continues

In case you hadn't heard -- We thought you might like an up-to-date report, from our perspective, of the new sidewalk the county is putting in in front of our house. It is almost at the stage to get ready for that sidewalk. However, before that can happen, lots and lots of work has been going on:

We watched while 10 to 14-foot deep ditches were dug out to put in a drainage pipe, then filled with tons of gravel. Ditches for new piping to the water main in the middle of the street were dug first, then, of course, filled again with gravel. Multiple manholes put in, at least six so far that we know about. Then some exciting events probably not anticipated:

A telephone pole started leaning toward the house and needed to be propped up until it could be secured. A worker was injured -- his nose was sliced off and he had some skin damage while cutting old water piping. Then there was sand that wouldn't stay put, undercutting part of the street, challenging the workers who tried to walk on it.

Pauline & Red invited those who wanted to see the "work in progress" to come by 18 August, Wednesday, while the work proceeded front of their neighbor's house on the corner. The ditch was being dug to hold the drainage pipe, installation of another manhole, only to have them cover the whole thing.

All of this is before they even get to the real part of the project, the actual sidewalk. It is quite exciting and educational.


