Community Youth Holiday Giving Event – December 18, 2014



This was the 16th year for this traditional Hazel Dell holiday event for kids in our community. It was held on Thursday, December 18 from 6 to 8 PM at Sarah J. Anderson Elementary school. The event was sponsored by the NE Hazel Dell neighborhood association and Three Creeks Community Partners. Over 400 kids attended with their parents, friends and other family members.

The Pioneer Choir, from Sarah J Anderson Elementary School and directed by music teacher Linda Wear, performed well known Christmas songs from 7:30 to 8 PM. Approximately 35 students from the choir performed before parents, fellow students and party guests.



Santa was a big hit again this year. Kids shared with Santa what they wanted for Christmas and many took the opportunity to have their picture taken with Santa. Kids were offered a choice of a wrapped gift or sports ball. No kid left without getting a toy for Christmas.

This year Waste Connections donated 59 bikes/helmets to be raffled off to kids in need of a bike. The children who received bikes were very appreciative and happy to receive this gift. Thanks to Waste Connections for this donation.



Metro Toy Drive provided a donation of 200 toys which were distributed to families in need in our area. Gene & Heather Schwindeman, Blind Onion Pizza, brought and gifted sports balls to kids at the event. Goodwill Job Connections brought hundreds of children's books which were given out during the event.

Yard & Garden land donated 6 Christmas trees. These were raffled off at the end of the evening to families in need of a Christmas tree and included the tree decorations.

Chuck's Produce donated 11 cases of fruit and Salmon Creek Fred Meyer donated another 3 cases. This time of

year many of the kids don't get fresh fruit. Bags of fruit were distributed at the event to every kid in attendance.

Clark County Food Bank and the Sunshine Division provide 48 food boxes which were distributed to needy families during the event. Thanks to the Sunshine Division, Clark County Food Bank and the individuals that also donated food boxes.

Refreshments were provided during the event by Burgerville and McDonald's. McDonald's served orange drink and over 800 freshly baked chocolate chip cookies. Burgerville served hot chocolate.

Most of all, thank you to the approximately 100 people who volunteered to help organize and made this a successful event. Several Spanish interpreters helped translate during the party.

The 10 week class meets once a week beginning February 5th and running through April 9th. Classes take place Thursday evenings from 6 - 8:30 PM. At the end of the 10 weeks, trainees are certified as Master Composter/Recyclers and become Sustainability Ambassador for the Clark County community. Trainees are asked to contribute 30 volunteer hours within a year of graduation to "Pay Back" their free training.

November Neighborhood Association Meeting Notes

We had two topics covered at the November neighborhood association meeting: Clark County Sheriff's office Traffic Patrol and S.A.L.T. program.

Deputy Bryce Smith, Clark County Sheriff's Office

At our November meeting tips on personal safety were shared to us by patrol deputy Bryce Smith who lives in the Sherwood Neighborhood and patrols the West Precinct and our neighborhood. We learned that break-ins in residential neighborhoods occur during the weekday in daylight hours, not typically at night. The burglars switch to Commercial businesses that are closed. If there is someone at your door, let them know you are home but not interested in what they are after. Never open your door to a stranger. It happens that 85% of the break-ins happen right through the front door. It is either unlocked or they kick-it in with one kick, even dead bolted doors don't stop them. There are safety measures you can install on your front door to slow them down. If there is a lot of noise they won't stick around. Your best bet to stay safe is to know your neighbors and watch out for suspicious activity in your area.

Shane Gardner, Sheriff Office Outreach

Sgt. Gardner share information about the CCSO Seniors and Law Enforcement Together (S.A.L.T.) program. Every month they meet and share information that can help seniors to be safe in our community.

Clark County Parks Adopt-A-Park Program

Clark County Parks believes that YOU can make a difference in how local parks look and operate! By participating in the Adopt-A-Park program, you will beautify a public space, while enhancing park safety and building community.

The Adopt-A-Park program is an ongoing volunteer opportunity, and we ask for a minimum six-month

commitment. By volunteering only twice per month, for two to three hours at a time, you can make a huge difference in your parks! You get to choose the days and times that you volunteer, so this is a great opportunity for those who have busy schedules. We encourage businesses, clubs, classes, community groups, and individuals to adopt a park! If you plan on volunteering as an individual, extra screening may be required.

Two parks in our neighborhood, Tenny Creek and Kate and Clarence LaLonde neighborhood parks have yet to be adopted by a group to help with the maintenance.

2014, The Year in Review

At our January 2014 neighborhood association meeting were heard from Battalion Chief Todd Iremonger about Fire District 6 services. Erik Kramer, Operations Director of the SW Washington Boys and Girls Club, talked about their program in Clark County and locally here in Hazel Dell.

In February, Kathy Morrison, Hazel Dell Lions Club, talked about Lions and service to our community. Lions help people with sight and hearing disabilities, as well as other services. Sam Ellingson - Manager of Community Relations, SW Washington Humane Society talked about their program here in Clark County.

The March 2014 neighborhood association meeting was about the "Birds & the Bees". Debi Kapral, of the Backyard Bird Shop, talked about local bird populations and Charles Bennett of the Clark County Beekeepers Club shared his knowledge

about bees and their importance in our daily lives.

Commissioner Steve Stuart resigned to join the City of Ridgefield as City Manager in April 2014. Commissioners Madore and Meilke appoint Ed Barnes to serve out his term. Jeanne E. Stewart is elected as County Commissioner in November 2014.

In April, our neighborhood association meeting had guest speakers with interesting information to share about their activities in the community. Marni Harrington of the American Red Cross, talked about Blood donations, as well as other services in Natural Disasters. Jaynie Roberts, Magenta Theater Director, talked about the theater and the live stage presentations for 2014.

May was an interesting month. The Hazel Dell Parade of Bands in 2014 honored past Grand Marshall's. The weather turn out great and the 20,000 plus spectators had a great time. Thank you to the Hazel Dell/Salmon Creek Business Association for staging a great community event with a long tradition.

Our May neighborhood association meeting focused on the environment. Bethany Lund, Clark County PUD discussed Invasive Weed Eradication program and Kevin Tyler, Clark County Environmental Services, discussed wetland mitigation program.

In June 2014, Clark County elected Freeholders completed their work in drafting a new County Charter. A majority of registered voters approved the new charter in the November election. Talks of transition to new county government began in earnest.

Sheriff Garry Lucas decides not to run for a seventh term and retires. Chuck Atkins is elected Sheriff, first new Sheriff in 24 years for Clark County. Changes are coming in the Sheriff's Office for 2015 as Sheriff Atkins takes office in late December 2014.
