School Bus Stop Rules

A new school year will be soon starting and many of our children will be riding the busses to and from school. The Washington State Patrol (WSP) would like you to take a few minutes to refresh your knowledge on how to drive safely around school busses as they are picking up and dropping off our children.

The WSP has posted a video discussing rules of the road and driving safety around the school busses; when you have to stop and when may proceed. The School Bus Stop Rules video is posted at <http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=moK9MZVSIQY&feature=plcp>

The law states the \$394 fine for failure to stop for a school bus cannot be

reduced, suspended, or waived. If you get a ticket for failure to stop for a school bus you will pay the full amount.

We cannot stress enough how important it is to practice safe driving, especially when children are present.

Can Development and Clean Water go together?

Yes – if you put a “Lid” on it

We all should be concerned about stormwater runoff. The increasing development of our county has led to natural surfaces being covered by roofs, yards, streets and parking lots. Excessive runoff from these impervious surfaces leads to erosion and carries pollution into streams and rivers.

Improving our management of stormwater runoff can protect drinking water, wildlife habitat, recreation and other quality of life factors. Low Impact Development is an approach to land development or re-development that works with the natural landscape to manage and minimize stormwater runoff. LID preserves and recreates natural landscape features and minimizes impervious surfaces that prevent water from soaking into the

ground, to create functional and appealing site drainage that treats stormwater as a resource rather than a waste product.

Clark County now requires low-impact development features, including native vegetation, pervious driveways and roads, downspout diversion, bio-retention features, and more natural storm water facilities like rain gardens.

In addition to the environmental benefits, Clark County businesses and residents benefit financially from having several local businesses that offer LID products and installation/maintenance services.

On the website there is a map of LID features that are installed throughout our community, so that you can visit and see the results for yourself. A LID demonstration for pervious pavement options is also under construction at Heritage Farm this summer.

Park land acquired by Clark County for future development

Clark County has purchased a 4.87 acre parcel of park land within the NE Hazel Dell Neighborhood Association boundaries. The property was acquired back in July and is located off NE 17th Avenue just north of NE Minnehaha street. The property is intended to eventually be developed into a future Neighborhood Park when funding is available. Until it is developed, the property will be improved to the level of open green space that folks can use for passive recreation

Homemade cleaners cost on average 3 to 4 times less than store bought cleaners, and will give you all the tools you need to create a spotless, yet healthy indoor environment.

Become a Master Composter/Recycler Volunteer!

Master Composter/Recycler Volunteer training provides community members with basic tools and knowledge that help conserve natural resources for a higher purpose than a landfill, reduce household waste, lessen climate changing gasses, and create a healthier community and planet.

Master Composter/Recyclers attend a FREE 10-session course that explores waste reduction topics such as backyard composting, vermicomposting, recycling, greener consumer choices, green-building, interpretive techniques, and more.

Participants then share what they learn with the Clark County community.

Think I'm recyclable? Not so fast!

The following common items actually CANNOT be recycled in your curbside (big blue) recycling bin. HOWEVER, they can be recycled at a number of different local locations; see back for addresses and contact info.

- Clean plastic drink cups**
Recycle me at: New Seasons, Far West Recycling
- Clean white styrofoam**
Recycle me at: Far West Recycling*, Green Neighbors Recycling Day Collection Events
- Clean plastic bags and film**
Recycle me at: Your local grocery store
- Soiled paper (plates, towels, tissues)**
Recycle me at: Learn to compost these items in your backyard and turn spoiled paper into soil! Otherwise, they have to go in the garbage.
- Paper drink cups**
Recycle me at: Nowhere. A wax or plastic liner makes these items neither recyclable nor compostable, but reusable mugs are a great alternative!
- Wet strength packaging**
Recycle me at: Nowhere. Though they seem like cardboard, these items have an additive that prevents them from being processed by paper mills. They should be placed in the garbage.

Alternate Recycling Locations:

- Clean clamshell plastics**
Recycle me at: Transfer stations, New Seasons, Far West Recycling
- Bulky rigid plastics**
Recycle me at: Transfer stations, Far West Recycling
- Clean plastic lids**
Recycle me at: Transfer stations, New Seasons, Far West Recycling
