

So You Know...

Clark Public Utilities maintains all Clark County street lights outside the Vancouver city limits. If you would like to report a street light out that's not in the city of Vancouver, you can report that outage directly to Clark PUD by going to the Clark Public Utilities website and completing a Street Light Out Form (www.clarkpublicutilities.com/index.cfm/your-home/lighting/safety-lighting/report-street-light-out-form/). It's easy to do, and Clark PUD usually gets that street light back in working order within 24 hours.

Emergency Preparedness:

1 Simple Thing You Can Do Today

Many of us want to be prepared for an emergency, but the list of things that we need can be daunting. Some of our neighbors may even have kits with food, first aid supplies, flash lights, and the like. There is one thing that many of us don't have, but we will desperately need in an emergency but may be missing from many of our preparations, water. **We should have 1 gallon of water per person per day.** The CDC recommends that we have a two week supply per person. Be sure to include extra water for your family pets too.
