CULVERT REPLACEMENT AND TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE

On Northeast Borin Road about one-eighth of a mile east of Northeast Hughes Road

PROJECT

McNealy Excavating Inc., a Washougal-based contractor working for Clark County Public Works, will replace a failing culvert under Northeast Borin Road.

The existing 24-inch corrugated metal culvert is about 20 feet long. An unnamed tributary of the Washougal River flows through the culvert.

WHY IS CLARK COUNTY BUILDING THIS PROJECT?

The culvert is rusty, undersized and about 85 percent filled with dirt and other debris. The contractor will remove the failing culvert and replace it with a much larger culvert. Large amounts of blackberry vines, other vegetation and debris will be removed. Gravel and other material will be placed in the replacement culvert to create a fish-friendly passage.

WHEN WILL CONSTRUCTION BE DONE?

The contractor expects to start work the week of Monday, Aug. 1, and wrap up by September.

Construction has been scheduled to start after the 2016 Peterson Cat Washougal Motocross National on Saturday, July 23, at the Washougal MX Park. Construction also will be done during a period when there will be minimal effect on fish in this unnamed creek.

HOW WILL CONSTRUCTION AFFECT ME?

Construction will require closing Northeast Borin Road to all traffic during culvert replacement. A detour map is on the back of this notice. Temporary signs will guide drivers around the road closure.

The contractor typically will work during days Monday through Friday but could work some evenings and weekends. Anyone close to construction could experience some noise, dust and vibration from the work.

WHAT ABOUT POLICE CARS AND FIRE ENGINES?

Clark County will alert police, fire and other emergency responders about the temporary traffic restrictions, along with the U.S. Postal Service.

HOW MUCH WILL CONSTRUCTION COST?

McNealy Excavating's bid, \$95,550, was the lowest of five bids received for this project. The Clark County Road Fund will provide 100 percent of funding to build this project.
