Whereas, 2016 is the 42nd anniversary of the Community Development Block Grant Program, one of the longest continuously run programs at the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development; and,

Whereas, Community Development Block Grant money is used by all cities, towns and neighborhood-based nonprofits throughout Clark County to address pressing neighborhood and social service needs; and,

Whereas, Clark County has undertaken more than 320 block grant activities since 1975; and,

Whereas, Clark County and other local governments have administered and customized the block grant program to identify and resolve pressing local problems such as job creation and retention, physical redevelopment and affordable housing; and,

Whereas, March 28 through April 1, 2016 has been reserved to recognize and appreciate the Community Development Block Grant Program.


Now therefore, this Board of County Councilors hereby proclaims March 28 through April 1, 2016, as






