JOINT PUBLIC HEARING OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COUNCILORS AND CLARK COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION – 2016 COMPREHENSIVE PLAN UPDATE

Clark County is updating its comprehensive plan to meet the June 30, 2016 Growth Management Act deadline. As part of the update process, the county is required to 1) adopt a population forecast for the next 20 years (to 2035); 2) adopt a land use plan that establishes urban growth areas that include a 20-year land supply; 3) complete a SEPA process on the potential environmental impacts of a preferred growth alternative; and 4) prepare a capital facilities plan outlining how projected growth will be paid for.

The purpose of the hearing is to take public testimony on the elements of the comprehensive plan update. Such elements include updates to the comprehensive plan map, comprehensive plan policies, the Clark County Code (mostly to CCC Title 40, the county's Unified Development Code), and the Arterial Atlas.

The Planning Commission will deliberate in a subsequent public hearing and make a recommendation to the Board. The Board will ultimately adopt a land use plan update in another public hearing. (Joint Hearing also held on May 19, 2016.)
