  - o Jennifer Reynold's last day working with Clark County is February 9<sup>th</sup>.
  - o City of Vancouver released their phasing cycle for the new IBC.
    - With Clark County, customers must have submitted their permit application, paid the plan review fee, and requested an intake appointment with permit staff before March 15<sup>th</sup> to be held to the current code. If they do not meet that deadline, they are subject to the new IBC.
  - Meeting both landscape percentage and rec area space requirements is a challenge for developers.
    - Mr. Odren attended a meeting with county transportation staff to discuss circulation issues.

- For example, they were required to put in a cul-de-sac which then kicked them out of compliance with the landscape and rec area requirements.
- To meet the requirement, they had to drop the type of unit they were proposing.

# Biannual Code updates / New WDFW Oregon White Oak Woodland Management Recommendations

- March 26<sup>th</sup> is a tentative Council work session date.
- The Dept. of Fish and Wildlife requested an additional code amendment to clarify state requirements for culverts.
- o The garage-cottage issue is in the biannuals, as directed by Council.
- In January, WDFW published management recommendations for Oregon White Oak Woodlands with detailed protocol for assessing oak functions and values and measuring impacts with encroaching upon or removing oaks, as well as guidelines for oak mitigation.
