#### Randle Namedive Explanation

I.A - Explanation of what the request does that has fiscal impact and the assumptions for developing revenue and costing information.

This Fiscal Impact reflects additional grant funding and a corresponding change in city / county funds. The description below remains unchanged from the original Staff Report PW 12-039 approved May 8, 2012.

Clark County has received federal funds to reconstruct Timmen Road between NE 279th Street and La Center Road. The existing concrete pavement will be crushed and overlaid with 5 inches of new asphalt. Guardrails will be replaced and modernized to current standard. The City of La Center will reimburse Clark County for the portion between NE 309th Circle and NE La Center Road which was annexed in 2011. Clark Public Utilities will be constructing a new 24 inch water main in Timmen Road from NE 279th Street to La Center Road and will reimburse Clark County for all work associated with installing the water main. Cark County will also overlay and reconstruct an adjoining portion of North and South 85th Avenue in the City of Ridgefield between NE 279th Street and South 5th Street. The City of Ridgefield will reimburse Clark County for this work. Timmen Road Project is currently in the 2013 adopted ACP in the Road Fund (item no. 21).



This Interlocal Agreement (AGREEMENT) between the municipalities is made and executed this \_\_\_\_\_ day of February 2013, by and between the CITY OF LA CENTER, (CITY) and CLARK COUNTY (COUNTY), pursuant to RCW 39.34.080.

WHEREAS, the CITY is planning to improve NW Timmen Road, from NE 309<sup>th</sup> Cir, (La Center's southern City limit) in the City of La Center to the intersection with La Center Road, within the city limits of La Center, Washington, hereinafter called the "PROJECT," by stabilizing or removing the existing failed concrete pavement and overlaying with asphalt within the existing road section. Guardrail, road signs and posts will be upgraded to current standards.

WHEREAS, the COUNTY is planning to improve NW Timmen Road, from NE 279<sup>th</sup> Street to the intersection of La Center Road hereinafter called the PROJECT), at the same time and to generally the same specifications as the CITY's project.

WHEREAS, it is mutually beneficial to combine CITY and COUNTY work into one construction bid.

WHEREAS, the CITY and the COUNTY have agreed that the COUNTY will provide professional engineering services for project management, survey, civil design, construction management, test services, environmental permitting, and grant administration for the project. The COUNTY will prepare plans, specifications, and an estimate suitable for competitive bidding as part of a combined COUNTY and CITY construction effort for base stabilization and overlaying of the PROJECT.

WHEREAS, the Project will be constructed to meet COUNTY road standards, or as modified by authorized modifications by the CITY; and

WHEREAS, The COUNTY and the CITY plan to begin construction in the spring of 2013.

- 1. The COUNTY agrees to provide services which will include without limitation, preliminary engineering, project management, survey, civil design, construction management, test services, environmental permitting, and grant administration to permit a constructible project as described in the Project Scoping Report (Exhibit A), January 20, 2012 Budget Memo (Exhibit B) and La Center Budget Estimate (Exhibit C), incorporated herein by reference. COUNTY grants for construction phase activities, including those within the CITY as described in the Construction Funding spreadsheet (Exhibit D), incorporated herein by reference. The CITY, in consideration of the work described above, agrees to pay to the COUNTY approximately \$360,905 which may be from a variety of funding sources, including Transportation Improvement Board grant funds.
- 2. Except as otherwise provided in this section 2, any modification to this AGREEMENT must be in writing and subject to the consent of each party. The COUNTY agrees to not exceed

the estimated budget amounts as described in the Project Scoping Report (Exhibit A) for each category of work including Preliminary Engineering, Right-of-Way, Construction or Construction Engineering, without first providing an explanation for exceeding the estimated amount and receiving written permission (email acceptable) from the CITY.

- 3. The CITY agrees to make monthly progress payments and at completion of the project. The final payment for remaining project costs shall be submitted within sixty (60) days after receipt of billing from the COUNTY. The final billing will occur after the project is accepted by the CITY.
- 4. No liability shall attach to the CITY or the COUNTY by reason of entering into this AGREEMENT or interlocal assistance except as expressly provided herein. This AGREEMENT is executed for the benefit of the parties and the public generally. This AGREEMENT is not intended and shall not be construed as creating any third-party beneficiary.
- 5. This AGREEMENT does not establish or create a separate legal or administrative entity or a joint board to accomplish the purposes hereof. The CITY and the COUNTY shall be jointly responsible for administering the performance of this AGREEMENT as provided herein. The CITY and the COUNTY will not acquire any jointly-owned real or personal property in connection with the performance of this AGREEMENT. Any real or personal property used or acquired by the CITY or the COUNTY in connection with the performance of this AGREEMENT shall be disposed of by that party as it shall determine in its discretion. Except as provided herein, the CITY and the COUNTY shall each be responsible for its own individual financial costs of performance of this AGREEMENT. No joint budget will be prepared to carry out the performance of this Agreement. The duration of this AGREEMENT will be as set forth in the Project Scoping Report.
- 6. Either party may terminate this AGREEMENT by providing to the other party 30 days' advance written notice of the date of termination, and by paying in full any balance owing for services rendered to the other as of the date of termination. Written notice shall be deemed given when it is actually received by the other party at the address as set forth with its signature, below.
- 7. This AGREEMENT shall be deemed to have been executed and delivered within the State of Washington. The rights and obligations of the parties hereunder shall be construed and enforced in accordance with, and governed by, the laws of the State of Washington without regard to the principles of conflict of laws. Any action or suit brought in connection with this AGREEMENT shall be filed in the Superior Court of Clark County, Washington.
- 8. The COUNTY shall not sublet or assign any of the services covered under this AGREEMENT without express written consent by the CITY.
- 9. Waiver by either party of any provision of this AGREEMENT or any time limitation

The COUNTY will prepare plans, specifications, and an estimate suitable for competitive bidding as part of a combined COUNTY and CITY construction effort for base stabilization and overlaying of 85<sup>th</sup> Ave/Timmen Road from S 5<sup>th</sup> Street to La Center Road.

WHEREAS, the Project will be constructed to meet CITY road standards, or as modified by authorized modifications by the CITY; and

WHEREAS, The COUNTY and the CITY plan to begin construction in spring 2013 and a construction contract was awarded for this work in December 2012.

- 1. The COUNTY agrees to provide services which will include without limitation, preliminary engineering, project management, survey, civil design, construction management, test services, environmental permitting, and grant administration to permit a constructible project as described in the Project Scoping Report (Exhibit A), incorporated herein by reference. The CITY, in consideration of the work described above, agrees to pay to the COUNTY approximately \$379,350 which may be from a variety of funding sources, including Transportation Improvement Board grant funds. Federal STP funding received by the COUNTY will be apportioned to the project as shown in Exhibit D attached and incorporated herein by reference.
- 2. Except as otherwise provided in this section 2, any modification to this AGREEMENT
