Briefing Paper Sheriff's Office Preliminary Space Needs Assessment Report by Mackenzie June 2018

Project Purpose:

- 1. Identify needs and goals for sheriff office replacement space that
 - a. Meet the county's needs,
 - b. Provide more efficient operational models,
 - c. Align with current space needs,
 - d. Provide for growth for the next 30 years,
 - e. Meet requirements for safety and security,
 - f. Incorporate critical services for staff and the public,
 - g. Create a strong civic presence.
- 2. Provide space and cost estimates.

Methodology:

Interviews and validation with key staff, programming, communication and goal setting.

Observations:

- Existing facilities are approximately 91,500 SF.
- Current space is approximately 16 percent less than the need.
- Spaces are used as effectively as possible given the shortages.
- Future needs include parking spaces for staff, public, secured stalls, and specialty vehicles.

Recommendations and considerations:

- Select a preferred approach for a centralized facility.
- Consider the impacts of freeing up desirable land for redevelopment in the downtown core.
- Consider moving the Sheriff (non-corrections) closer to response and service areas to allow more convenient access for the public to the services.
- Use this information as a compliment to evaluations of correction facility space needs. Correction facility options might vary based on the recommendations in this report.
