An underlying principle of the Plan is the need to maintain the comprehensive continuum of care that has been developed over the last several decades.

The Consolidated Homeless Grant (CHG) provided by the Washington Department of Commerce is one the county's major funding sources for programs that serve persons experiencing homelessness to obtain and maintain housing stability. One of the requirements of the CHG is to have a local homeless housing plan aimed at eliminating homelessness. The Department of Commerce requires Clark County to update and approve the local housing plan at least every five years, as per (RCW 43.185C.050). The Clark County Homeless Action Plan was last updated and submitted in 2014.
