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BACKGROUND

The Washington Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs (WASPC), acting as funding authority for the State of Washington, has awarded \$246,405.52 to the Clark County Sheriff's Office (CCSO) acting for all Clark County law enforcement agencies. This award is to be used to "verify the address and residency of all registered sex offenders and kidnapping offenders under RCW 9A.44.130." Verification is to be face to face at a frequency designated by the state that varies based on the offender's designated offense level. The grant period is July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019.

Of the total amount of the award, CCSO would retain \$115,260.76, which would be used to fund salary and benefits of an existing deputy sheriff project position originally authorized in 2008 and extended an additional year with this grant award. The grant would also pay other expenses related to the program. The remainder of the funds will be passed through to six other law enforcement agencies in Clark County (Battle Ground PD, Camas PD, La Center PD, Ridgefield PD, Vancouver PD, and Washougal PD) in proportion to population. These agencies will use their funding to implement the program for sex offenders living within their cities.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

The active registration and regular address verification of known past sex offenders serves the dual purpose of keeping citizens apprised of offenders living near them and facilitating arrests in the event of repeat offenses. Informed citizens are better able to protect themselves and their children, thus preventing future offenses.

Dear Sheriff Chuck Atkins:

The Washington State Legislature allocated \$10 million dollars over the 2017-2019 biennium for the Registered Sex Offender Address Verification Program. This year, local agencies will receive \$4.91 million dollars to conduct face-to-face address verifications for registered sex and kidnapping offenders as directed by RCW 9A.44.130.

I am pleased to inform you that the Clark County Sheriff's Office will receive \$246,405.52 for the Registered Sex Offender Address Verification Program. The grant cycle will follow the state fiscal year, starting July 1, 2018 and ending June 30, 2019. Quarterly grant reports are due on October 10, 2018, January 10, 2019, April 10, 2019, and July 10, 2019. Quarterly grant reports are to be completed electronically and will be emailed to RSO Coordinators. Reports must be received by WASPC prior to grant payments being issued to your agency.

Address verification funds are designed to support all aspects of Registered Sex Offender Address Verification. Most importantly, funds are <u>required</u> to be used for face-to-face verification a sex offender's address at the place of residency.

- For Level I Offenders—Face-to-Face Address Verification will occur once every twelve months
- For Level II Offenders—Face-to-Face Address Verification will occur once every six months
- For Level III Offenders—Face-to-Face Address Verification will occur once every three months

For the purposes of this grant, unclassified offenders and kidnapping offenders are considered level I offenders, unless the local jurisdiction sets a higher classification in the interest of public safety.

Additionally, funding from this program will be used to send at least one staff person to at least one WASPC OffenderWatch User Group and SONAR Committee Meeting. Address verification data must be entered into the statewide sex offender database, OffenderWatch.
