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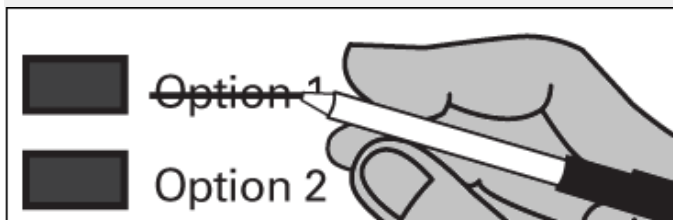

School Program Renewal Levy

The Board of Directors of Evergreen School District No. 114 adopted Resolution No. 6115 concerning renewal of an expiring levy for educational programs and operations. This proposition provides funding for educational programs and operations expenses not funded by the State. If approved, Proposition 3 will authorize the District to levy the following excess taxes, on all taxable property within the District, as provided in Resolution No. 6115.

 The Board of Directors of Evergreen School District No. 114 adopted Resolution No. 6116 concerning a technology capital levy. This proposition provides funding for updated technology, software, and digital learning tools for classrooms in all schools, plus training for teachers, and authorizes the District to collect the following excess taxes on all taxable property within the District for the following six years. If Proposition #4 is approved but Proposition #3 is not approved, this tax will not be collected.

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Ridgefield School District No. 122
Proposition No. 3

General Obligation Bonds - \$77,000,000
The Board of Directors of Ridgefield School District No. 122 approved Resolution #2018-2019-003 concerning this proposition for bonds. This proposition would authorize the District to construct a new K-4 elementary school, expand Ridgefield High School and renovate its vocational education building, construct covered play areas and upgrade HVAC systems at South Ridge and Union Ridge Elementaries, and make safety and security upgrades District-wide; to issue \$77,000,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within a 21 year maximum term; and to levy excess property taxes annually to repay the bonds, as described in Resolution #2018-2019-003.

Replacement Levy for Maintenance and Operations
The Board of Directors of Vancouver School District No. 37 passed Resolution No. 814 concerning this proposition to maintain current educational funding. This proposition authorizes the District to continue funding students' educational needs and school operations by levying the following excess taxes to replace an expiring levy on all taxable property within the District, for educational programs and daily operational expenses, including textbooks, classroom materials and staff:
