## Recipe for Healthy Soil ~ Compost

Relax; this is an easy recipe to follow. And if you don't have all the ingredients, you probably have some neighbors that would be willing to contribute to your compost.

Ingredients for compost:

1 Large wheelbarrow full of brown stuff (fallen leaves, straw, etc.)

1 Large wheelbarrow full of green stuff (lawn clippings, yard trimmings, etc.)

1 Shovel or pitch fork and a little elbow grease

**Mix:** Mix thoroughly and moisten slightly so entire pile feels like a wrung out sponge.

**Pile:** Your pile should reach 3 feet high by three feet wide in all directions or approximately one cubic yard.

**Heat:** Naturally your pile will begin to heat as microscopic critters and fungi begin their work decomposing your pile. The highest temperatures (130° to 160°F) may be reached in 3 to 5 days. Keep your pile moist like a wrung out sponge and turn your pile once a week so there will be plenty of oxygen available to keep the microbes healthy and multiplying; continue turning occasionally for several months.

**Apply:** When it's done cooking, your brown leaves and green grass clippings should be un-recognizable; they'll look and smell like rich forest soil. Add finished compost to garden, lawn or flower beds. This will improve your soil by increasing organic matter, which increases nutrient retention and helps the soil hold water.

Enjoy: The benefits of home composting are many...you prevent waste and save precious landfill space, you save money on disposal, and you

improve your environment with a healthy alternative to petrochemical fertilizers.

How can I learn more about backyard composting?

The Clark County Master Composter/Recycler program offers free educational materials, yard debris and food waste composting workshops and training throughout the year. ### Graffiti Removal

Do you have concerns about the amount of GRAFFITI popping up in the NE Hazel Dell area, as well as Clark County, the City Of Vancouver and the I-5 corridor? Well you can be part of the solution. The experts advise that graffiti must be removed ASAP to send a message that it is not acceptable. Otherwise, left standing it conveys a message that we do not care and it is OK to add more. Graffiti has a negative impact on community

livability and is a blight to our neighborhoods and commercial district. Studies show that graffiti, if removed with-in 24 hours to 48 hours results in a nearly zero rate of re-occurrence. Please make every effort to remove the graffiti on your property ASAP.



The Clark County Sheriff's Office recommends that you report an active graffiti artist (?) right away by calling 911. Otherwise they request you to document the graffiti with a picture and report the date, time and place of the graffiti to the Sheriff's Department, Community Outreach Unit, at 360-397-2211 ext. 3380. To report graffiti on the I-5 corridor please call the State Hwy. Department at 360-905-2000 and express your concerns.

If you notice graffiti on private property that never seems to go away, we can help. As your Neighborhood Association we have composed a letter that we would be happy to send out to the private property owner that will draw their attention to the matter and hopefully get some actions. ### Panhandling

Effective in 2015, Panhandling in Clark County is a violation of Clark County Code 9.18 to solicit for goods, services or money when adjacent to a public roadway (i.e.: at a freeway off-ramp or intersection) if the vehicle being solicited is not legally parked. The fine for a first offense is \$250. Also panhandlers must not step into the roadway and/or disrupt the flow of traffic. If there a problem, call 911 immediately.

In addition, ever wonder how to handle a situation when you are approached by a panhandler? According to the Clark County Sheriff's Office, they would advise all citizens to use caution when encountering panhandlers, as the vast majority of the chronically homeless panhandlers fit either or both of two main categories: 1) un-medicated mentally ill and/or mentally unstable individuals; 2) drug and/or alcohol addicted persons. Also a fair number of the chronically homeless are convicted sex offenders.

The Sheriff's office also offers common sense reaction to panhandles.

1) Always look potentially aggressive people in the eye which conveys confidence on your part just like an upright and confident body posture. Respond to panhandlers as your conscience dictates relative to your surroundings. A polite "No, Thank You" or a "No, I'm sorry." is enough.

2) It is advisable not to offer panhandlers food, money or a job. If you offer them a gift card for food, most likely they will trade it for money. Many kind hearted people who have given them work and then become victims of burglary, assault and/or fraud. Generally, they are interested in money to feed their additions. 3) The many agencies and charitable organizations out there are often well known to panhandlers. Several agencies have outreach teams that contact potential clients in the field. The panhandlers and/or homeless are often unwilling to behave in a manner consistent with the requirements of the organization.

Presently there are no statistics on panhandlers who are truly homeless or just con-artists. These cautionary statements are in no way to discourage the benevolence of citizens toward those who are disadvantaged. Clark County has many ministries and shelters that are better equipped to handle concerns of the homeless through kind donations, as well as professionals who can assist them.

As a side note, panhandling in the City of Vancouver is not illegal. However, panhandlers must not step into the roadway and/or disrupt the flow of traffic.

### Street Resurfacing

The Clark County Public Works' Road Department will start resurfacing work on June 5th, 2017 in the NE Hazel Dell area (weather permitting). Rough and damaged areas along NE 68th Street, NE 72nd Street and NE 16th Avenue will be ground out. Then all three roadways will be resurfaced with asphalt. A- NE 68th Street will be resurfaced from NE Hwy 99 to NE 28th Avenue. The balance of NE 68th St. East to NE St. Johns Road is owned by the City of Vancouver. B- NE 72nd Street will be resurfaced from NE Hwy 99 to NE 16th Avenue. C- NE 16th Avenue will be resurfaced from NE 72nd Street to NE 78th Street. There are no additional sidewalk plans in these street improvements at this time.

The balance of NE 68th St. East to NE St. Johns Road falls within the City Of Vancouver. The City plans sometime this summer to repave with asphalt only the South side of the street in front of the new apartment complex.

Then the balance of the street from NE 28th Ave. to NE St. Johns Road will have a tar/slurry treatment. In addition sidewalks will be added in front of the new apartment complex only

according to the City's Public Works Road Department

### Street Advertisement

Ever wonder who is responsible for those pop-up street advertisement signs like: GUN SHOW; BUY YOUR HOME; TAX SERVICE; BUY OR SELL THIS OR THAT; GARAGE SALE; etc... Well these signs are illegal if placed on State or County or City or Private property without permission. If signs appear and are never taken down, you may contact Clark County Code Enforcement 360-397-2408 or Google their web site and fill out a complaint form. Unclaimed signs are also a form of litter and a blight to the neighborhood. Violators can be subject to fines of \$103 per violation and/or community service.

### Opt Out of Junk Mail & Cut Paper Waste

Credit card offers, catalogs, coupon booklets, flyers and phone books, multiple phone books. While all these things can be recycled, if you didn't want them in the first place, a better way to deal with them is to take your name off their mailing or delivery list.

There are several companies that offer an 'opt out' service.

**Opt Out - Marketing Junk Mail** You can have your name removed from marketing mailing lists by contacting the Direct Marketing Association (DMA). Visit the DMA's website at <https://dmachoice.thedma.org>, by email to [consumeratthe-dma.org](mailto:consumeratthe-dma.org) or by telephone at (212) 768-7277. If you don't have internet access, the Direct Marketing Association offers both an online and a mail in option for residents. Online registration is free. To register by mail, for a \$1 charge, you can enter up to three individuals at the same address. Include your complete mailing address and a check or money order for \$1, and mail to DMAchoice, Direct Marketing Association, PO Box 643, Carmel, NY 10512.

**Opt Out - Telephone Directory** You can opt out of receiving a telephone

directory at [www.yellowpagesoptout.com](http://www.yellowpagesoptout.com). It may take up to 12 weeks for the selections to be accepted by the publisher's internal systems. Note: Directory publishers listed on the site generally do not accept opt-out requests from third parties or websites proclaiming to submit such requests on your behalf. Protect your personal information by using the website to work directly with the directory publishers.

**Opt Out - Catalog Choice** Catalog Choice offers a basic service to opt out of unwanted catalogs, coupons, credit card offers, and circulars delivered to your home or business for free. Additional services are available for a fee. Visit their website to learn more: [www.catalogchoice.org](http://www.catalogchoice.org).

**Opt Out - Junk Faxes** and more Unsolicited advertisements sent to your fax machine are sometimes called "junk faxes." In most cases, Federal Communications Commission (FCC) rules under the Telephone Consumer Protection Act and Junk Fax Prevention Act prohibit sending junk faxes. To stop unwanted junk faxes, unwanted calls, text or robocalls, go to the FCC's website at [www.fcc.gov/stop-unwanted-calls](http://www.fcc.gov/stop-unwanted-calls).

### New Park to be Developed

The new park is located on NE 17th Avenue just North of NE Minnehaha. The county is referencing this as the West Minnehaha Park for now.

The 4.87 acre parcel was purchased in July of 2016 at a cost of \$858,000. Paid for by a Park Impact Fund which is generated from fees charged to Clark County Developers.

The Parks Department is currently working on an Open House date to meet with the General Public so we can give a proper name to the new park and talk about what kind park does the General Public want it to be. They will have samples pictures of different playground equipment, picnic tables, benches, barbecue pits, asphalt pathways etc.... for review at that meeting.

The present park location has gone thru what they call a LEVEL #1 clean-up. The land has been cleared of brush and unnecessary trees which were shredded on site and spread around to compost naturally. The area has been fenced and park rules posted. Until finishing touches can be decided on and developed this area will be known as an OPEN GREEN SPACE. The General Public is welcome to use the space but must follow Park Rules. Sometime in late 2017 the park grounds will be rotor-tilled, leveled and over-seeded. In 2018 final touches will be completed in the park.

**NE Hwy 99 Lane Re-Striping**

Were you having trouble locating and/or staying in the lane lines along NE Hwy 99's core business district? Well, you were not alone. Shortly after the NE Hwy 99 Sewer Project was completed in October 2016 the contractor re-striped the lane lines. Due to new EPA guidelines the State can no longer use oil based paints. Everyone had to switch to water based paints. Unfortunately, the application of water based paints require a longer drying time to cure properly. October and subsequent months of rain had taken a toll on the lane lines and has brought up a host of traffic safety concerns. After numerous complaints, the Clark County Public Works - Road Department re-striped some of the lane lines this past April 4th. Official replacement lane lines and low concrete lane barriers will be reinstalled after the repaving of sections of NE Hwy 99 which will take place shortly after Labor Day.

**Hwy 99 Resurfacing**

Shortly after Labor day, September 4th, 2017, rough and damaged sections of Hwy 99 will be ground out and replaced. All of Hwy 99 will then be resurfaced with asphalt from the Train Trestle to NE 78th Street intersection. Low concrete center barriers will be replaced at certain intersections and the lanes will be re-striped for cars and bicycles. The Clark County Public Works' Road Department planned this road resurfacing to take place after the 2016 Sewer Project on Hwy 99.
