We are also pleased to announce that one of our Executive Board members Roger Entekin has been accepted to begin training for certification to be a member of Neighbors on Watch (NOW). This is an organization under the supervision of the Sheriff's department to provide "Eyes and Ears" to assist our deputies in helping make our community safer.

### SAFETY BEGINS AT HOME

#### 3 THINGS YOU CAN DO TO AVOID FRAUD

Crooks use clever schemes to defraud millions of people every year. They often combine new technology with old tricks to get people to send money or give out personal information. Here are some practical tips to help you stay a step ahead.

1. **Spot Imposters.** Scammers often pretend to be someone you trust, like a government official, a family member, a charity, or a company you do business with. Don't send money or give out personal information in response to an unexpected request – whether it comes as a text, a phone call, or an email.
2. **Do online searches.** Type a company or product name in to your favorite search engine with words like "review," "complaint" or "scam." Or search for a phrase that describes your situation, like "IRS call." You can even search for phone numbers to see if other people have reported them as scams.
3. **Don't believe your caller ID.** Technology makes it easy for scammers to fake caller ID information, so the name and number you see aren't always real. If someone calls asking for money or personal information, hang up. If you think the caller might be telling the truth, call back to a number you know is genuine.

### NOW- Neighbors on Watch

Neighbors on Watch is a volunteer program for the Sheriff's Office that allows citizens to patrol in pairs. The program adds extra watchful eyes and ears to the community. It is a high visibility, no confrontation program that requires a 24-hour training academy and a 10 hour mentoring period. Volunteers are asked to commit to four hours of service each month. Presentations may be scheduled for neighborhood association meetings.

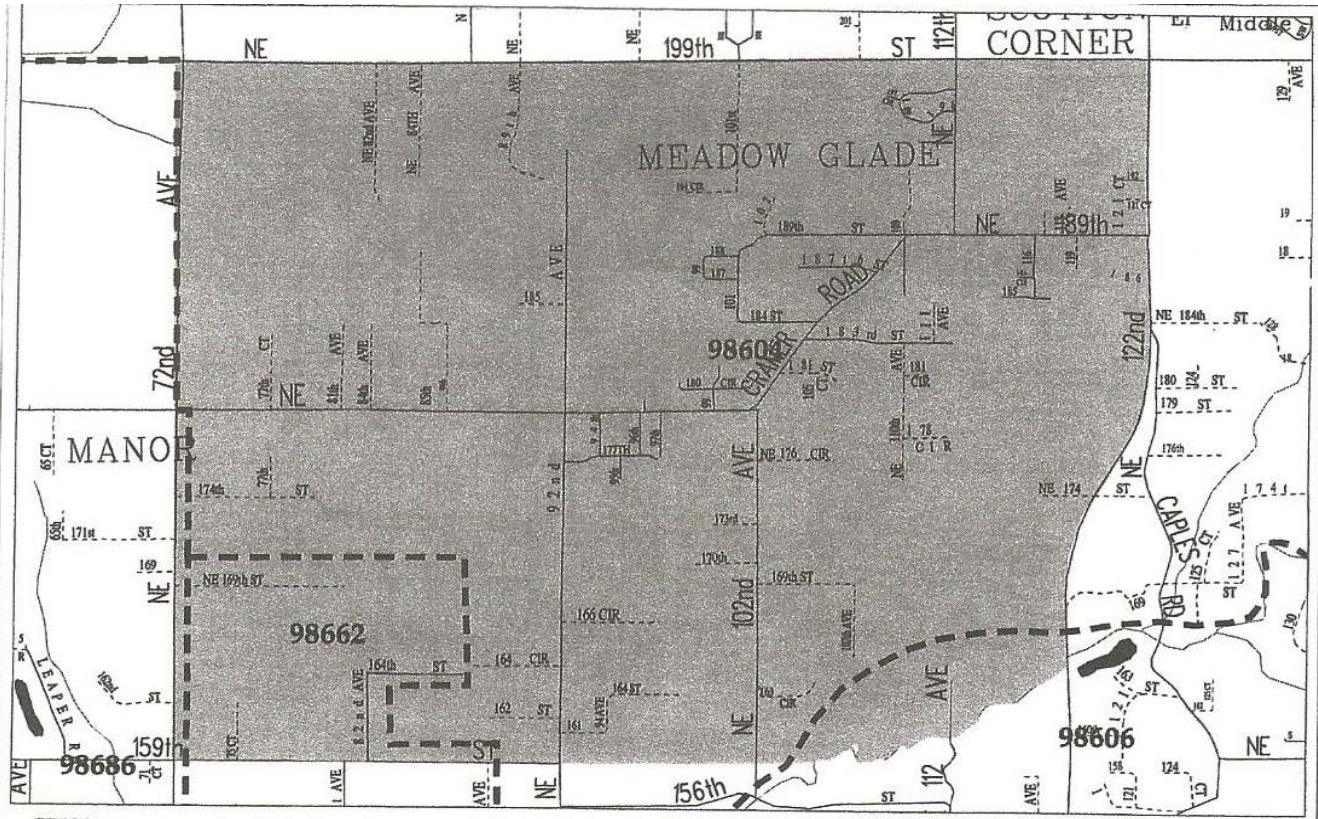
