Join us at the next **North Salmon Creek Neighborhood Association** general meeting as we have several important topics on the agenda.

We'll hear from **Clark County Fire District 6** about staffing at the neighborhood stations and the upcoming EMS levy. We'll have our **Sheriff's Office Liaison Deputy Kennison** on hand who will spend some time updating us on recent CCSO activities in the area as well as answering any CCSO-related questions you may have. And we'll also have an opportunity to discuss important neighborhood activities and events, including those in the surrounding areas such as the proposed **Psychiatric Hospital off of 134th Street**.

This is our last meeting before we break for the summer, so if you want to hear more about what's going on in the neighborhood, or have information to share, please don't miss this important meeting.



Update on Springstone Psychiatric Hospital

(Ed note: While not technically within our NA, this proposed facility is immediately adjacent, and residents of the NSCNA are potentially affected by its presence.)

Late last year, the State of Washington/Department of Health awarded Springstone a Certificate of Need to establish a 72 bed acute care behavioral health/ psychiatric hospital to be named Rainier Springs, pending a Conditional Use Permit from Clark County. The facility will be located behind the Holiday Inn Express in Salmon Creek.

In public comments, Springstone, the facility management, has stated that they will not be providing any residential chemical dependency services, services are acute/short term behavioral health/psychiatric inpatient services.

The mental health community supports this hospital, as they state with only 23 crisis beds in the entire county there is currently a shortage of places where people with mental health issues can receive assistance. This facility is projected to offer 72 beds serve, with clients staying approximately 7-10 days, and may include places for seniors and some for medicaid clients, while the remainder will be private pay.

Local Neighborhood Association concerns were primarily over safety, however, the facility said it will be not serving what ...

How to help keep your home safe when you're on Vacation. The following are just a few of the recommended steps you can take to protect your home when you are away.

- Create the Illusion of Someone Home - Beyond setting your lights on a timer, you can also set the television and radio on a timer to create the typical noise and flickering lights of an average family home at night. Leave a car in the driveway. Arrange for someone to mow at least once a week. Handling Emergencies, Do I call 9-1-1 or call 3-1-1?

The Clark Regional Emergency Service Agency (CRESA) wants to make it as simple as possible to decide between calling 9-1-1 or 3-1-1. If you are experiencing an immediate emergency dial 9-1-1 for any and all fire and medical calls, a crime in progress especially if it involves a gun, or if you need the police to prevent or stop an injury. Please call 9-1-1 if you feel you are in danger. If you are in doubt, call 9-1-1 to be safe.

Reasons for calling 3-1-1 is to make a police report, noise complaints, stolen property and civil issues. Please report a crime or suspicious activity to the Sheriff's office by using 3-1-1. It's the only way the Sheriff's department can track problems in our community. By doing so you are not only helping yourself be safe, but all your neighbors too.
