Master Plan Background

Heritage Farm is a 79-acre site located along NE 78th Street, about half a mile east of Highway 99 in Hazel Dell. In 2010, Clark County adopted a site master plan that commits the county to preserve the property's agricultural heritage and history as a poor farm and to encourage use of its agricultural, historical and educational amenities.

Changes at Heritage Farm since 2010 need to be reflected on the plan, and the County is seeking community input to guide the master plan update.

What will the plan update do?

- »» Review changes since adoption of the master plan
- »» Review, validate or revise plan elements within its existing master plan vision and guiding principles
- »» Review farm priorities

The project started in December, with adoption by the County Council in June 2019.
