| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Michael: Look at revising the sidewalk criteria. He gave an overview of the sidewalk program. Currently completing sidewalk projects on 72<sup>nd</sup> and 172<sup>nd</sup> Avenue. Question: were the projects from the Bike and Pedestrian plan?</li> <li>Changes in criteria: current criteria vs. adopted criteria from the Bike and Ped plan</li> <li>Leveraging sidewalk funds: Michael said there are \$1.9 Million in grant applications. The County sidewalk program budget is \$500-700K. SRTS: 172<sup>nd</sup> Avenue, 104<sup>th</sup> Avenue, Sacajawea.</li> <li><a href="http://www.walkinginfo.org/webinars">www.walkinginfo.org/webinars</a></li> <li>Jennifer Campos: similar criteria for large sidewalk projects vs. smaller infill projects (requests).</li> <li>CMA question: Neils Lane and Rossiter Lane submitted in collaboration with C-Tran. It is hard to get grant money for sidewalks.</li> <li>Lynda: Map 21 combines programs into one pot of money; potential for more local control.</li> <li>Chuck: scoring system complicated; look at options and consider looking at the complete neighborhood option; match funds in another area.</li> </ul> |                                   |                                 |
