Accreditation

- A process of validation that involves the measuring of an organization's performance against a recognized set of standards
- ▶ CCPH is currently pursuing accreditation through the Public Health Accreditation Board (PHAB)
 - Voluntary
 - National
 - Modeled after Washington State Public Health Standards


Why is accreditation important?

- ▶ Enhances competitiveness for funding
 - ▶ Improves credibility, accountability
 - ▶ Encourages quality improvement
 - ▶ Improves relationships with community and partners
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Required documentation

- ▶ **Community Health Assessment (CHA)**
 - Presented to BOH January 2016
 - ▶ **Health Department Strategic Plan**
 - 2015–2016 plan approved by BOH in February 2015
 - ▶ **Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP)**
 - In progress
 - BOH will hear more today
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


