
Youth Marijuana Prevention & Education Program (YMPEP) 5-year Strategic Plan



- ❖ What: monthly workshops (January-August 2018) facilitated by internationally recognized Social Marketing Consultant Nancy Lee to develop a social marketing campaign around safe and secure home storage of opioid prescription pain medications grant funded through Washington Healthcare Authority (WA-HCA) Opioid prevention grant (21 participants & 492 total training hours)
- Purpose: reduce youth access to opioids through positive behavior change by locking up opioid prescription pain medications
- * Who: collaboration of 21 stakeholders from Clark County Public Health, Klickitat County Public Health, ESD 112 Communications, ESD 112 Prevention & Youth Services, PeaceHealth Southwest and 8 partnering coalitions from the southwest region of Clark, Skamania and Klickitat counties
- * Focus Audience: parents and grandparents with youth grades 6th-12th living in or frequenting the home
- ❖ **Pilot Launch:** One of the Clark County event sites during the National Drug Take Back Day on April 29th 2019


