



You will receive verification of approval within a day or two. This clearance is good for 2 years, so if you did one last year you are good to go.




1. Go to the Clark County Sheriff's Office web page: https://clark.wa.gov/sheriff



- 2. Click on the "File an Online Crime Report" bar (see red arrow above)
- 3. Scroll down the list until you come to "Traffic Complaint" (second from the bottom)



- 4. Click the circle to select. Then click the continue button at the bottom lower right
- 5. Complete the online report staring with information about yourself.



Drive-Thru Drug Take-Back

Saturday

April 27, 2024 10 am - 2 pm

Bring any unused medication for safe, free disposal at these drive-thru Drug Take Back Event sites in Clark County:

- ◆ Any prescription and over-the-counter medication including pills, liquids & inhalers will be accepted for safe, FREE disposal.
- Medications may remain in original containers and labels do not need to be removed.
 Medications not in original containers will be accepted too.
- Vaping devices & e-Cigarettes WITHOUT Batteries will also be accepted for free disposal at all event sites EXCEPT Cowlitz Indian Tribal Public Safety Department.
- Sharps and syringes will be accepted from noncommercial sources ONLY at the PeaceHealth SW Urgent Care event site. Use an approved Sharps container when transporting; if one is not available, use a rigid plastic container with a lid (ex: plastic milk jug) & label the container: WARNING-SHARPS DO NOT RECYCLE
- NO prefilled syringes will be accepted for disposal at any event site.
- For everyone's safety, participants will remain in vehicles & use a drive-thru process to dispose of unwanted & expired medications.

Does Shredded Paper Go Into the Blue Recycling Bins???

We know that there will be a need to shred paper as long as there are bills and credit card offers in the mail. However, *shredded paper is NOT accepted in curbside recycling carts*.

Some options for shredded paper:

- Drop your pre-shredded paper off at a transfer station for secure recycling at no cost. Shredded paper from a truck or service provider gets baled and does not have to be sorted before it heads to a paper mill.
- Add shredded paper to a worm bin or compost bin at home.
- Check the <u>RecycleRight</u> app to get the names of private services that will take your paper for shredding for a fee or watch for notices of free shredding events.

Remember that if you have doubts as to whether something can be properly recycled, please put it in the trash. So, if these options for shredded paper don't work for you, it's OK to put it in the garbage cart. No guilt.

Free COVID Test Kits -- Here's how to get yours

As of November 20,2023 every U.S. household can again place an order to receive four more free COVID-19 rapid tests delivered directly to their home. If you didn't order tests since the program reopened in September 2023, the site will let you place two orders for a total of eight tests.

Order your test kits through www.covid.gov/tools-and-resources/resources/tests

The kits will include instructions on how to verify extended expiration dates. Many kits have had their expiration dates extended beyond what may be printed on the packaging.

You don't have to pay for shipping, and you'll never be asked for a credit card or bank account number. You only need to give a name and shipping address.

If you'd like an email confirmation and delivery updates from the U.S. Postal Service, you can submit your email address.


How Many Dogs Do You See?
